REDEVELOPMENT PLAN FOR THE BROWNS MILLS TOWN CENTER REDEVELOPMENT AREA; AND WHEREAS, SINCE THE DATE OF THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL'S ORIGINAL DESIGNATION OF THE BROWNS MILLS TOWN CENTER REDEVELOPMENT AREA AS AN AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT UNDER THE LRHL, THERE HAVE BEEN NUMEROUS CASES IN WHICH THE TRIAL AND APPELLATE COURTS OF NEW JERSEY HAVE INTERPRETED THE LRHL; AND

WHEREAS, IN ONE OF THESE CASES, <u>HARRISON REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY V. DEROSE</u>, 398 <u>N.J. SUPER.</u> 361 (APP. DIV. 2008), THE APPELLATE DIVISION HELD THAT PROPERTY OWNERS WERE ENTITLED TO NOTICE THAT THEIR PROPERTY WAS IN AN AREA DESIGNATED IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT UNDER THE LRHL AND THAT SUCH DESIGNATION MAY RESULT IN THE SUBSEQUENT ACQUISITION OF THEIR PROPERTY BY EMINENT DOMAIN; AND WHEREAS, IN LIGHT OF THE DEVELOPMENTS IN NEW JERSEY CASE LAW INTERPRETING THE LRHL, THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL HAS DETERMINED THAT IT IS APPROPRIATE FOR THE PLANNING BOARD TO RE-STUDY THE BROWNS MILLS

TOWN CENTER REDEVELOPMENT AREA IN ORDER TO CONFIRM THAT THIS AREA CONTINUES TO MEET THE CRITERIA OF AN AREA IN NEED OF REDEVELOPMENT AS DEFINED BY THE LRHL AND, AS PART OF THIS PROCESS, TO PROVIDE THE NOTICES TO PROPERTY OWNERS DESCRIBED WITHIN <u>HARRISON REDEVELOPMENT AGENCY V. Motion by Prickett and Cartier to introduce Ordinance No. 1-2010 with a public hearing on March 3, 2010. Prickett, yes; Cartier, yes; Inge, yes; Stinney, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

10. NEW BUSINESS

a. Approves PTMUA's award of 2010 professionals' contracts for Attorney, Auditor and Engineer, as to the fees.

Council President Scull advised that this approval as to the fees is required by statute.

Motion by Prickett to approve the PTMUA's award of 2010 professional contracts for Attorney, Auditor and Engineer.

Mrs. Stinney clarified that this is just for the fees.

Motion died for lack of second.

Mr. Bayer advised he would look at the statute to see what the legal ramifications are.

b. Review of proposals received from Planner Rick Ragan regarding the Redevelopment Plan and from ARH for Well #13 and related water system problems.

A discussion ensued regarding the costs and whether or not Administration could see if ARH could negotiate their price down. Mr. Prickett expressed he was ready to support the approval of this proposal but would like to see the price be lowered.

Motion by Prickett and Cartier to approve ARH's proposal with a not to exceed and if possible less than \$67,695. Prickett, yes; Cartier, yes; Inge, yes; Stinney, yes; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

Mr. Bayer noted that Ragan Design Group's proposal is related to Resolution No. 70-2010.

Motion by Cartier and Stinney to approve Ragan Design Group's proposal not to exceed \$8,500. Cartier, yes; Stinney, yes; Prickett, yes; Inge, abstain; Scull, yes. Motion carried.

c. Review of draft resolutions establishing a procedure requiring pre-approval of certain purchases.

Mrs. Finlay clarified that Mr. Vaz is looking for Council to choose one of the two resolutions in their packets. The items listed in number two are items that need to

be approved prior to a meeting so that operations are not held up. There is not a written policy but it has been an established policy that anything over \$2,000 must be presented to Council for approval. The second resolution will change that policy to 15% of what the bid threshold is which is allowable under the local public contracts law. Mrs. Finlay noted that it is Council's pleasure to stay with the current policy or to go with what the statute allows. Mr. Bayer advised the bid threshold is \$21,500 and changes year to year. Council discussed which resolution to add to the next meeting's agenda. Council gave a consensus to add the second resolution for 15% of the bid threshold to the next meeting agenda.

GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Council President Scull opened the meeting to general public comments. Those indicating a desire to be heard were: Steve Skulimoski: 1. Confirmed a lobbyist was hired at the last meeting. Asked if they turned in the town's earmarks and met deadlines. Mayor Patriarca advised the earmarks will be going out this week. 2. Asked if they were fined by the state for well #11. Mayor Patriarca informed that they did not get fined for well #11. The Mayor added that they did receive a fine from the DEP but it was for certain notifications that were not made when taking over the Lake Valley Water Company which occurred in a prior Administration. Mr. Skulimoski recalled that Mr. Vaz stated at the last council meeting that they have issues with the wells, and he would like to know what those issues are and what costs are involved. The Mayor informed that they are providing a good product regarding their water; it is safe and what they have done to take precautions with well #11 is not required by the state. Mayor Patriarca expressed that they have wells that were dug ten years ago that were never officially put on line, and they are looking to get them on line to give them the adequate supply they need in the Township especially since well #11 is down. Council President Scull added that the proposal Council approved tonight addresses well numbers 6, 7, 11, 12 and 13. Mr. Skulimoski is speaking but is inaudible. **Sharon Troia and** Carolyn Smith: 1. Both are residents of Belaire Trailer Park. Commented on increase of gang activities and vandalism, and informed that residents are not allowed to have fences. Mrs. Scull asked the Mayor to forward these concerns to Chief Lewandowski. The Mayor confirmed he would, noting that he was not aware of these problems. Mr. Cartier asked if the Township has the right to patrol there as it is private property to which the Mayor responded yes. Ms. Troia asked who is responsible for the street lighting in the trailer park as it is very dim. Mayor Patriarca remarked he would look into the developer's agreement. 2. Commented that the basketball court in the trailer park is locked so the children cannot use it. Mrs. Scull reiterated that they will look into the developer's agreement. 3. Asked how future sewer installations will affect rent increases. Mrs. Scull advised that Mr. Bayer is looking into rent control boards. Mayor Patriarca spoke of a resident that brought in a model ordinance from another mobile home park in another area that they might be able to utilize. 4. Stated Belaire Trailer Park has a bad reputation and needs help to make changes. Jim Smollouk: 1. Asked if Belaire Trailer Park pays their past due bills do they get their license back or do they have to reapply. Mr. Bayer advised their license was not suspended, it was not renewed; therefore, they would have to reapply when their water and sewer bills are current. He advised that he gave the Mayor a sample rent control board ordinance. There being no additional members of the public indicating a desire to be heard, Mrs. Scull closed the meeting to public comments.

SOLICITOR'S REPORT:

Andy Bayer: Reported that the Appellate Division affirmed the Township's rental registration ordinance. There has been a significant legal discussion regarding that result. It is a published opinion, and he has received numerous calls from lawyers as well as the Mayor of Collingswood expressing an interest in looking at their ordinance. There have been a lot of positive responses.

ENGINEER'S REPORT:

Dave Cella: Thanked Council for authorizing ARH's proposal. He will see what can be done to minimize the cost.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

David Patriarca: 1. Commented on an article in the Burlington County Times regarding a conceptual plan of the revitalization of Browns Mills. 2. Mr. Prickett asked the Mayor for clarification on Resolution 69-2010 which is the settlement agreement between the DEP and the Township. Mr. Prickett asked if currently the levels are acceptable to which the Mayor replied yes. 3. Mrs. Scull asked for a date for the Live Where You Work kick off. Mayor Patriarca replied that the program is available now, and there will be a kick off to inform the public as to what is available to them but a date has not been determined. The Mayor briefly described the Live Where You Work program.

COUNCIL MEMBER COMMENTS:

Rick Prickett: 1. Looking forward to spring. **2.** Announced that budget hearings are coming up in March. **3.** Wished everyone a good night.

Diane Stinney: 1. Suggested a neighborhood crime watch and gang seminar for Belaire Trailer Park. 2. Commented on an article in the Burlington County Times regarding the Black History Fashion Show at the Pemberton Township High School scheduled for Friday, February 26. 3. Encouraged everyone to attend the open house at Deborah Hospital on Saturday, February 27. 4. Commended Mrs. Scull for a job well done. 5. Thanked everyone for coming out and voicing their opinions in a respectable manner. Wished everyone a blessed evening. 6. Thanked Council and Council President Scull.

Ken Cartier: 1. Commended Public Works on clearing the roads from the last two snow storms. **2.** The Deborah Heart Challenge is Sunday, February 21st at Pemberton High School. The exhibits open at 1:30. **3.** Wished everyone a good night.

Tom Inge: 1. Thanked everyone for coming out.

Sherry Scull: 1. Informed that the senior citizens are appreciative of the efforts of the interact club and the Senior Valentine Dinner Dance. There were approximately 100 seniors that attended at the Senior Center. Mrs. Scull asked Mr. Wells to let the School Board know how appreciative the senior citizens are. 2. The next business meeting will be on Tuesday, February 23rd at the municipal building. 3. Commended Public Works on a great job clearing the roads after the recent snow storms. 4. Thanked everyone for coming out. Wished everyone a nice evening and encouraged everyone to attend the Deborah Heart Challenge.
