WHEREAS, THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON IS ONE OF 53 MUNICIPALITIES WITHIN THE NEW JERSEY PINELANDS; AND WHEREAS, DEVELOPMENT WITHIN THE PINELANDS MUNICIPALITIES ARE GOVERNED BY THE RULES ESTABLISHED BY THE NJ PINELANDS COMMISSION IN THE NJ PINELANDS COMPREHENSIVE MANAGEMENT PLAN; AND

WHEREAS, THE PINELANDS COMMISSION DOES NOT PERMIT THE CONSTRUCTION OF SOLAR ARRAYS OR WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS AS A PRIMARY USE IN THE RURAL, AGRICULTURAL AND FOREST LAND MANAGEMENT AREAS; AND WHEREAS, THE GOVERNING BODY OF PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP HAS DETERMINED THE FOLLOWING:

- 1. WIND AND SOLAR ENERGY ARE AN ABUNDANT, RENEWABLE AND NONPOLLUTING ENERGY RESOURCE.
  2. CONVERTING WIND AND SOLAR RAYS TO ELECTRICITY WILL REDUCE OUR DEPENDENCE ON NONRENEWABLE ENERGY RESOURCES, AND DECREASE AIR AND WATER POLLUTION THAT RESULTS FROM THE USE OF CONVENTIONAL ENERGY SOURCES.
- 3. DISTRIBUTED SMALL WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS WILL ALSO ENHANCE THE RELIABILITY AND POWER QUALITY OF THE POWER GRID, REDUCE PEAK POWER DEMANDS, AND HELP DIVERSIFY THE STATE'S ENERGY SUPPLY PORTFOLIO.
- 4. SMALL WIND ENERGY SYSTEMS AND SOLAR ENERGY SYSTEMS MAKE ELECTRICITY SUPPLY MORE COMPETITIVE BY PROMOTING CUSTOMER CHOICE; AND WHEREAS, NEW JERSEY'S RENEWABLE PORTFOLIO STANDARDS (RPS) REQUIRE EACH SUPPLIER/PROVIDER, AS

DEFINED AT N.J.A.C. 14:8-1.2, THAT SELLS ELECTRICITY TO RETAIL CUSTOMERS IN NEW JERSEY TO PROVIDE A PERCENTAGE OF THEIR RETAIL ELECTRICITY SALES FROM RENEWAL ENERGY SOURCES, BEGINNING AT 3.5 PERCENT IN 2004 AND INCREASING TO 22.5 PERCENT BY 2021; AND WHEREAS, THE MUNICIPAL LAND USE LAW (NJSA 40:55D-2.N) PROVIDES THAT TO PROMOTE UTILIZATION OF RENEWAL ENERGY RESOURCES IS A PURPOSE OF ZONING; AND

WHEREAS, THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON RECOGNIZES AN IMPORTANCE OF PROVIDING ALTERNATIVE ENERGY SOLUTIONS IN ALL AREAS OF THE PINELANDS, ESPECIALLY ON EXISTING FARMS, LANDFILLS OR OTHER SIMILARLY DISTURBED AREAS.

A RESOLUTION OF THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT WITH BURLINGTON COUNTY CONCERNING THE BURLINGTON COUNTY

RECYCLING PROGRAM AND THE ACQUISITION OF AUTO CART CONTAINERS
WHEREAS, THE TOWNSHIP OF PEMBERTON HAS ENTERED INTO YEARLY AGREEMENTS, CALLED SOLID WASTE SERVICE CONTRACTS, WITH THE BURLINGTON COUNTY BOARD OF CHOSEN FREEHOLDERS PURSUANT TO WHICH THE BOARD HAS AGREED TO PROVIDE FOR THE COLLECTION AND DISPOSITION OF RECYCLABLE MATERIALS GENERATED BY THE TOWNSHIP'S RESIDENTS; AND

WHEREAS, THE COUNTY HAS DETERMINED TO IMPLEMENT A "CART PROGRAM" BY WHICH RESIDENTS WOULD USE CARTS FOR THE RECYCLING OF PAPER AND CARDBOARD THAT CAN BE EMPTIED INTO COLLECTION VEHICLES BY SPECIALIZED EQUIPMENT BECAUSE USE OF THESE CARTS (A) HAS BEEN FOUND TO IMPROVE RECYCLING PARTICIPATION AND MUNICIPAL RECYCLING RATES AND (B) RESULTS IN FINANCIAL SAVINGS AND OTHER BENEFITS TO THE COUNTY AND MUNICIPALITIES; AND

WHEREAS, THE COUNTY HAS DETERMINED TO SOLICIT OR ARRANGE FOR THE SOLICITATION OF BIDS FOR ITS PURCHASE OF AUTO CARTS FOR PAPER RECYCLABLES IN 2010 FOR AND ON BEHALF OF BURLINGTON COUNTY MUNICIPALITIES THAT ARE INTERESTED IN IMPLEMENTING USE OF AUTO CARTS; AND WHEREAS, THE COUNTY WILL BASE THE NUMBER OF AUTO CARTS IT PURCHASES ON COMMITMENTS FOR CART PURCHASES MADE TO IT BY PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP AND OTHER MUNICIPALITIES THAT ARE SERVED BY THE

COUNTY'S RECYCLING PROGRAM; AND WHEREAS, THE TOWNSHIP HAS DETERMINED TO MAKE A COMMITMENT TO THE COUNTY TO PURCHASE UP TO 2,100

ADDITIONAL CARTS THROUGH THE COUNTY'S 2010 (SPRING) SOLICITATION IN A TOTAL AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED \$51,000, WITH SIX ANNUAL PAYMENTS COMMENCING ON APRIL 1, 2011.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL OF PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP, LOCATED IN THE COUNTY OF BURLINGTON AND STATE OF NEW JERSEY, THAT THE GOVERNING BODY HEREBY EXPRESSES IT SUPPORT FOR THE COUNTY'S AUTO CART CONTAINERS PROGRAM AND RECOGNIZES THE BENEFITS IT OFFERS TO PEMBERTON TOWNSHIP RESIDENTS.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED BY THE TOWNSHIP COUNCIL THAT THE MAYOR AND TOWNSHIP CLERK ARE HEREBY AUTHORIZED TO EXECUTE THE GRANT AGREEMENT, SUBJECT TO THE AVAILABILITY OF FUNDS FOR THE NEXT SUCCEEDING SIX FISCAL YEARS.

**c.** Review of storm water management and recycling ordinance amendments.

Mr. Rehmann advised of the new requirements issued by the State. Mr. Clark informed that he will have drafts regarding the mandatory and voluntary involvement for the next meeting. Mr. Rehmann suggested Council thoroughly read through the requirements and suggested the ordinance be made more "people friendly". Mr. Rehmann added ARH will review the ordinance and make some recommendations at no charge.

## **GENERAL PUBLIC COMMENTS:**

Acting Council President Cartier opened the meeting to general public comments. There being no members of the public indicating a desire to be heard, Acting Council President Cartier closed the meeting to public comments.

## **SOLICITOR'S REPORT:**

**Mr. Dave Clark:** Commented on the Lake Valley apartment complex litigation in that they have filed a petition for certification to the Supreme Court. They are in the process of filing a responsive brief opposing the petition. The Supreme Court will look at the case and decide if they will hear it.

## **ENGINEER'S REPORT:**

Mr. Chris Rehmann: 1. Noted that the NJ Department of Transportation and the Federal Highway Administration have authorized funding of \$339,000 for the North Pemberton Train Station Project. They will be going out to bid to start the project. 2. The contractor is putting the play surface on Imagination Kingdom. 3. Holding off the contractor on Lemmon Avenue, Phase I due to the high levels of ground water. 3. Still waiting on the final draft of the Administrative Consent Order regarding Well #11 and radium issues. They are looking for additional capacity in present water supply system to handle summer usage. Pump tests have been performed on Well #13 and submitted to the State to increase the well's capacity. There is still a disputed contract with Tiger Construction Company regarding Well #12. They anticipate resolving the contract, and getting Well #12 on line which would have similar capacity to Well #11. This would resolve most of the water problems they are anticipating. Mr. Cartier asked about the affects of the high water table on their roadways. Mr. Rehmann responded it depends on what the sub-base is made of and noted that it has not been good weather for their roads.

## **MAYOR'S REPORT:**

**Mayor David Patriarca:** 1. The rubber surface is being put down at Imagination Kingdom, and DPW is working on the landscaping and decorative fencing. The gazebo has been delivered and will be installed starting tomorrow. 2. Monday, April 12<sup>th</sup> will be the first scheduled court date in the renovated court room. 3. Leaf pick up will begin April 19<sup>th</sup>.

## **COUNCIL MEMBERS' COMMENTS:**

**Richard Prickett: 1.** Stated that Spring is definitely here as he saw a bald eagle catch a groundhog in a field across from his home. **2.** Looking forward to the Senior Prom next week. **3.** Wished everyone a good night. Glad to see everyone tonight.

**Mayor David Patriarca:** Advised the Fire Chief requested Administration let the public know this is a red flag time frame for fires.

**Diane Stinney:** 1. She and her husband and are looking forward to the Senior Prom scheduled for Wednesday. 2. Commented on her experience at Deborah Hospital, and cannot speak enough regarding the emergency room. 3. Thanked everyone for coming out and hopes to see everyone on April 21<sup>st</sup> and the Prom.

**Tom Inge: 1.** Thanked everyone for coming out, and wished everyone a safe trip home.

**Ken Cartier: 1.** Thanked everyone for coming out, and wished everyone a safe trip home.
