PREREQUISITES

A mandatory prerequisite test will take place at Mirror Lake Beach. All participants must be able to pass the following in order to participate in the Junior Lifeguard Program:

- 100-meter freestyle swim in 2 minutes, 30 seconds
- Tread water for 2 minutes
- Swim under water 10 yards
- Circuit of 10 push ups, 20 crunches and 100-yard run

JUNIOR LIFEGUARD GOALS

- To demonstrate and teach water safety, life-saving techniques, swimming techniques for rescue, kayak & canoe skills and safety (tentative), equipment inventory, maintenance & inspection
- To participate in physical conditioning, group and team-building activities
- To review additional requirements of being a lifeguard including, site maintenance, self safety (hydration, sunscreen, etc.), working as a team, customer service and patron safety

JUNIOR LIFEGUARD PARTICIPATION RULES

- Show interest in the program, every day!
- Do not go on dock without permission
- No running on the dock
- No diving
- No horseplay
- No swimming under dock
- Always listen to instructors and lifeguards
- Do not go into water without permission
- Do not swim with food or gum in your mouth
- Throw away of your trash and any other trash that you may encounter or see
- Take away everything that you brought with you

We have the following expectations of the Junior Lifeguards:

- Conduct selves in a professional and courteous manner
- Use kind language to other participants and be inclusive-minded
- Will immediately let the instructor and/or assisting instructor know if there is a problem
- Must arrive ready to learn and participate
- Will not leave the group at any time without consent
- Will not leave the beach area without a parent or guardian
- Must use the Buddy System during the program especially when doing water activities

Parents:

- You must sign your child in and out of the program every day
- Smoking is not allowed on township property
- Any questions you may have please ask instructors before or after the program
- Keep any other children not participating in the program away from the Junior Lifeguard Program

PROCEDURES

When to arrive:

Participants should arrive at the beach, ready to go, no later than 8am

What to bring:

Always bring your swim suit, towel, goggles, water shoes, sunscreen, lip protection, notebook & writing utensil, drink and light snack. You may want to bring an extra set of clothes, hat and/or sunglasses for sun protection.

Disciplinary Actions:

If a Junior Lifeguard is disruptive during the program, he/she will be removed for a short period of time with a warning and the parent/guardian will be notified when picked up. If the behavior continues, they will sit out the rest of the class. The third infraction will result in a one day suspension from the program. If unacceptable behavior continues, the Junior Lifeguard may be expelled from program.
